Our mission is to promote the rights of tamariki to outdoor play in Otautahi by connecting with communities, identifying barriers, and collaboratively creating pathways to ensure every tamariki enjoys the freedom to play.

Measuring our success:

- Our trust is approached by the council, community groups and other local organisations as a source of information and support regarding tamariki play
- Our trust is approached for feedback or opinions on local play preservation issues/projects
- Our trust is approached to support tamariki and their voices in issues regarding outdoor play

Measuring our success:

- We collate data to assess the community's general awareness of the importance of play
- We hold /participate in events at least 6 times a year to promote and educate on the importance of outdoor play, and keep a record of the attendance.
- Feedback from our events is mostly positive about what people have learned or had the opportunity to share
- Our website/social media has been accessed, and resources have been downloaded

Measuring our success:

- We have developed resources for pop-up play spaces that can be hired out.
- We are having conversations with the local communities/organisations to formulate ideas, co-create, and execute plans to enhance/create accessible outdoor spaces for play
- We host pop-up play events and track attendance. The events generate useful feedback about challenges, barriers or positive experiences people are experiencing in their neighbourhoods
